### **Recent Updates**

*A ground-to-ground missile rocked AlSadd Road, housing Palestinian families south of Syria. The onslaught resulted in heavy material damage and in a state of panic among women and children.*



*AlSadd Road is home to dozens of Palestinian families, along with hundreds of families displaced from beleaguered Daraa Camp.*

*Palestinian refugees stranded south of Syria have been subjected to a calamitous situation. Residents of Daraa Camp, in southern Syria, continue to sound distress signals over the exacerbated health and socio-economic conditions they have been grappling with. At the same time, unabated shelling on the camp resulted in the destruction of nearly 70% of civilian homes and took away the lives of dozens of unarmed residents.*



*Reporting from southern Syria, AGPS news correspondent said two Palestinian girls, sheltered in AlMuzeireeb town, were kidnapped by the Syrian government troops on Friday on their way to Daraa to receive cash aids distributed by UNRWA.*



*Palestinian refugees sheltered in Daraa and AlMuzeireeb have often appealed for a hand-to-hand distribution of relief aids by UNRWA for fear of being kidnapped in the abrupt abduction sweeps launched by pro-regime forces.*

*In a related development, dozens of Palestinian refugee families forcibly deported from Khan AlSheih Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq, to Idlib have*



*launched a cry for help over their deteriorating state of affairs.*

*The displaced civilians called on UNRWA to urgently step in and take up its duties as regards hundreds of women and children who have been enduring a dire humanitarian situation.*

*The displaced Palestinians said they have not received UNRWA aids as Idlib falls outside the agency's fields of operation.*

*Some 2,500 Palestinian refugees were forcibly deported from Khan AlSheih Camp to Idlib, north of Syria, as of Monday, November 28, 2016, following a reconciliation deal struck between the Syrian government forces and the opposition outfits.*

*In another development, Palestinian student from Syria Tasnim Ahmed Tarshahani won the first award at the best war footage competition held at Netherlands schools.*



*Tasnim, formerly sheltered in Aleppo, is expected to be honored, along with other students, by the Queen of Netherlands.*



### ***Palestinians of Syria: May 26, 2017 Statistics:***

- *At least 3,502 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,407 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,138 and 989 days.*



- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,482 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 216 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
