"Turkish Authorities Agree to Hand Over The Bodies of Three PRS Killed at its Borders with Syria"



- Another refugee from Al-Sayida Zaynab camp dies out of his wounds caused by recent bombings.
- PRS family accuse Turkish border guards of killing their son while crossing.
- Syrian Regime bombards Dara Camp by missiles and artillery.
- Palestinian families displaced from Syria stuck in Macedonia appeals for help solving case.
- 148 Victims from Khan Eshieh Camp killed since the beginning of war.

VICTIMS

Palestinian refugee "Ayman Mohammed Saleh Alzengari" died of wounds sustained in the bombings that hit Al-Sayida Zaynab Camp in Damascus Countryside on Sunday 21 February 2016, which caused more than 100 victims and 200 injuries, bringing the toll of PRS victims who were killed in the bombings to 39 victims.

Family of the Palestinian refugee "Mohamed Ahmed Al-Khalili" from Al-Yarmouk Camp, accused Turkish border guards of killing their son, according to the family narration, via a letter arrived to the AGPS, their son accompanied by his wife and children were trying to cross the Syrian border into Turkey fleeing the war behind and in order to travel to European countries, but the border guards opened fire on Muhammad right in front of his wife and children, the family asked the Turkish authorities and human rights organizations to open an investigation and punish the perpetrators.



It is noteworthy that this is not the first time refugees are subjected to abuses by Turkish army at the borders. AGPS documented many cases concerning this incidents.



RECENT UPDATES

General Commission for Palestinian refugees, affiliated to the Syrian interim government, announced receiving approval of the Turkish authorities to hand over the bodies of three Palestinian refugees who have been shot by the Turkish army during crossing Turkish borders, they are:

"Hanan Moses" was born in 18 December 1975, "Aamina Saleh" born 09 October 1993, and "Imad Azzouz" born 01 December 1982. The Commission added that the Turkish authorities will hand over the bodies trapped in the Habur region southern Turkey, on Tuesday 1 March 2016 for burial according to Islamic traditions assets, while the child "Jaafar Azzouz" who survived will remain in Sloppy government hospital awaiting the arrival of relatives to Turkey to pick him up.



Turning to southern Syria, where Dara Camp was hit by heavy shelling as well as "elephant" rockets and tanks artillery, which caused a state of panic and fear among the people, and severely damaged houses and properties. Meanwhile, local sources said the Syrian regime forces tried to infiltrate the camp but the violent clashes prevented that.



Observers believe that the bombing operations are considered as a clear violation of the truce signed between the majority of the conflicting parties in Syria under the auspices of UN, which came into effect yesterday.



In a different context, a number of Palestinian families displaced from Syria, known as the Palestinians of Seventy, stranded in Macedonia, appealed to international and human rights organizations and the PLO in order to help them and put pressure on the Macedonian government to allow them to emigrate to European countries.

Those families who had lived in Syria since 1970 does not have Syrian travel documents, but passports of Palestinian authority, described the humanitarian situation as dire as a result of the lack of accommodation for all refugees, adding that many of them sleep in open areas and sit on the ground, which caused a state of frustration and depression.

It is noteworthy that the Macedonia is one of the points through which refugees flee the war in Syria to Europe.

Monitoring and documentation team in the AGPS revealed that the number of victims from Khan Eshieh Camp since the beginning of the war



in Syria reached "148" victims, of whom 61 were killed by shelling, 29 by gun shots, 4 by sniper shots, 23 under torture, 1 executed in the field, 12 abducted and killed after, 6 drowned in the sea, 4 as a result of a car bomb, 6 shot by the Israeli Army, 2 for unknown reasons, and 1 died of asphyxiation.

It should be noted that the total number of Palestinian refugees who were killed since the beginning of the war in Syria is (3174) victims, according to Statistics documented the working group for the Palestinians of Syria.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 26 February 2016

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 987 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1049 days, water cut for 537 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 843 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1036 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.

- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
