Victims

The Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) announced on its Facebook page the death of six militants while fighting alongside the regime army in bloody clashes with ISIS in AlTanaf area, in AlBadia region.

The victims are: Omar Fayad, Ibrahim Kasem Diab, Mustafa Omar Beshara, Mohamed Shehabi, Alaa Shahoudi (a resident of Yarmouk Camp), Mohamed Haythem Ahmed Issa (from AlSbeina Camp), and Ahmed Atiyeh Samara (from AlSayeda Zeinab Camp).

AGPS documented the death of 222 PLA combatants in hostilities rocking Rif Dimashq province.

Nearly 6,000 fighters are enlisted at PLA, 3,000 among whom have been directly involved in battles waged across over 15 flashpoints in Syria.



Latest Developments

The Syrian government forces on Sunday allowed the residents of AlSbeina Camp to return to their homes which they had left some four years ago in the hunt for a safe shelter.



Thousands of residents flocked to ALSbeina crossroads before they headed to their homes. Their joy was, however, marred by the massive destruction inflicted by the government onslaughts on the area.



In another development, displaced Palestinian refugees south of Damascus expressed their deep anger and disappointment over the poor-quality bread loafs handed over by the National Committee for Relief of Yarmouk Camp.

The refugees leveled heavy criticism at the concerned parties, saying the distributed bread is not fit for human consumption but rather as cattle feed.





Meanwhile, a Palestinian family said their 23-year-old relative, a resident of Yarmouk Camp, died under torture at Palestine Branch lock-up, run by the Syrian government in Damascus.

Speaking on condition of anonymity, the family said the victim was killed four years after he was kidnapped by the government forces.

According to AGPS data, 469 Palestinians died under torture in Syrian government jails.

Palestinians of Syria: August 27, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,561 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,628 Palestinian refugees, including 103 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,502 days in a row.*
- *197 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,239 and 1,080 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,575 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 328 days.*
