“Inspection Campaign on Al Ae'dein Camp in Homs, and the Syrian Army Prevents Residents of Husseinia and Sbeina camps to return to their homes”



Al Ae'dein camp in Homs

- Seven days passed on the signing of the neutralization agreement and yet nothing is new.

Recent Updates

Inspection campaign in Al Ae'dein camp in Homs by members of the Syrian Security Forces where they broke into some closed shops and inspected it thoroughly, as they searched cars and request personal cards for passers, which cause panic among people. Residents of Al Ae'dein camp are suffering of widespread unemployment in addition to the high cost of living and high prices of food supplies.

A number of youth in Khan Al Sheih camp at Damascus city have been injured after the bombing of Katna town that was while trying to bring water to people in the camp.

On the other hand, people of Husseiniya and Sbeina camps are still barred from returning to their homes by the Regular Army checkpoint and some Palestinian factions loyal to it, where they were prevented from returning to their homes without obvious reasons.

The Syrian Army fully controlled these camps, after violent clashes erupted between the Regular Army and some Palestinian factions loyal to it on one hand, and between groups of Free Army on the other.

These clashes ended with the full control of the Regular Army over Husseiniyeh camp since October 2013, and Sbeina camp since November 2013.

Continuation of activities that are calling for the return of the two camps residents to their homes, and it worth to mention that the people of the two camps had been distributed to camps and neighboring towns, which added more economic burden, especially with the high rents of houses and widespread of unemployment.

People of Yarmouk Camp in Damascus are still waiting for permission to return to their homes, where seven days passed to sign an agreement to neutralize the camp between the Syrian Authorities represented by the head of the Intelligence Branch of Palestine, and a number of representatives of relief and civil committees and Armed Brigades inside the camp.



Meanwhile the residents are complaining of the sluggish implementation amid a state of anticipation and anxiety over the fate of the agreement, for fear that his fate will be similar to the agreements in previous months.

Lebanon

Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon suffer of complicated crises, from the most prominent faces are legal and economic, where the Lebanese authorities have taken strict procedures against them, especially regarding to the restrictions imposed on their entry into Lebanon and the possibility of extending their residency permits. The procedures led to the dispersal of many families where its members, who are in Syria, will not be able to catch up with their families in Lebanon. As about the economic side, families suffer of the high cost of living in general and homes rents in particular as well as the inability of refugees to work in Lebanon, for several reasons, including the legal status and widespread of unemployment.



Civil Work Committees

The Pharmacy of Palestine Charity Committee continues its work to provide free medicines to patients of the trapped residents of the Yarmouk camp since about a year, so as to relieve their pain and suffering, as the Committee continues to provide many services including health, relief and other services.
