## **Cyprus**

*A number of Palestinian Syrian and Syrian refugees organized an open sit-in in front of the Cypriot parliament protesting on the continued deterioration of their deplorable humanitarian and living conditions, and the non-implementation of their demands and help them to overcome their plight and access to European countries and to be reunited with their families. The protestors demanded from the Cypriot authorities to re-open an investigation into the incident of killing the Palestinian refugee "Ahmed Abdullah," a resident of Al Baramka neighborhood in Damascus, who was found dead on a road on 26th of December, after several days of his disappearance in mysterious circumstances in a camp for refugees.*

*It is noteworthy that 340 Palestinian refugees are still detained by the Cypriot authorities in a suburb of the Cypriot capital, Nicosia, after the Cypriot navy rescued their boat from sinking on their way to Italy on 26th of September 2014.*

## **Recent Updates**

*Two air strikes by Syrian warplanes raided on Daraa camp areas and towns surrounding it, leaving only material damages, in the light of the continued bombing by warplanes and mortars, which resulted in massive destruction of homes. The remaining residents are complaining of the continuation of cutting off water to all parts of the camp for 259 days respectively.*

*Meanwhile, the Syrian regular army still prevents the residents of Al Husseneia camp to return to their homes for 444 days under the pretext of securing the area, while the displaced people are suffering from stressful living crises because of the continuing war in Syria.*

*It should be noted that Al Husseneia camp witnessed wide destruction and battles between the Syrian regime forces and the armed opposition forces until the regular army, the militias, the Committees of the General Command, Fatah Al-Intifada, and the Palestinian Popular Struggle Front, which is fighting alongside with it, have imposed their control at the camp on 11 \ 10 \ 2013. These forces did not allow the residents, who were displaced to neighboring areas, to return to their homes, despite the*



*area is free of militants and under control of the regime, however, and repeated promises from senior Syrian government officials and the Palestinian embassy.*



#### *Al Husseneia camp*

*In the south of the capital Damascus, the residents of the Yarmouk camp are suffering of the lack of necessities of life, especially with the continued lack of distribution of food aid from UNRWA for the third consecutive week, in addition to the closure of Beit Sahem checkpoint which led to the loss of all food materials and the high prices. In the meantime, the water cuts in the Yarmouk camp for 112 days respectively, in light of the continued siege imposed by the regular army and groups of the PFGC for more than a year and a half, where people are suffering from great difficulties in securing their food in addition to the scarcity of fuel, water and electricity cut for the entire camp.*

*On the other hand, residents of Khan Dannun camp are still living in a state of instability and anticipation of the unknown fate, especially in the last few weeks, after the hostilities pace has increased in the adjacent regions and towns between the Syrian opposition and the regular army forces and the participation of some residents belonging to the PFGC and Fatah al-Intifada in the fighting alongside with the regular army, making the camp subjected to bombardment and the fall of a number of missiles at different places which led to many victims and injuries.*

*According to statistics issued by the AGPS, early last month, the number of victims, who have died from Khan Dannon camp, because of the ongoing events in Syria, has reached 12 people.*





### *Khan Dannon camp*

*In the same context, the residents of AL Nairab camp are suffering of continuous power cut for seven days forcing them to return to share generators, which added a new economic burden on their shoulders, as the camp's residents complain of the deteriorating fuel crisis due to the scarcity of diesel and gas, in addition to the water cut for most of the neighborhoods for four days due to the full blackout in all of Aleppo city.*

### **Missing**

*The Palestinian refugee (Yazan Salih Khalil) was missed, he was born on 1993 from the Yarmouk refugee camp, while he was leaving Syria heading to Egypt in order to emigrate to European countries, and there were no information about him until this moment.*

### **Lebanon**

*Al Wafaa European campaign delegation ended its tour in Lebanon on 12.28.2014 after presenting relief aid for a number of Palestinian Syrian refugees in different areas in Lebanon, Al Wafaa Campaign also organized, in collaboration with Syrian Medical League, a free medical day at Al Bass camp in Sour area.*



### ***The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 29/12/2014***

- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *2592 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS including 157 women, 283 were killed due to torture, 268 were killed by sniper shot, 84 refugees were field executed, and 984 refugees were killed due to bombing.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 542 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 622 days, water was cut for 112 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.*
- *80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan, 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.*
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 444 days respectively.*
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 414 days respectively.*
- ***Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for 615 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- ***Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost 259 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.*
