Detainees

Syrian security services arrested a number of Palestinian prisoners' families during the past few days, after they were heading to a number of security branches to ask about the fate of their detained relatives. Some of the detainees were recognized; they are:

- *"Leila Abu Amr" from Al Raml Camp in Latakia, mother of the detainee "Hisham Manna" who is detained since 2011*
- *"Rania Al-Mohammad," Mother of the detained woman "Salam Ammar" from Yarmouk camp, and was detained for nearly two months.*
- *"Hikmat Sayyah," aunt of the detainee "Jihad Sayyah" from Khan AL Shieh camp, and was detained several days ago.*
- *"Bushr AlSalman" brother of the detainee "Bashir Salman," a resident of Damascus city, and was detained since 2012.*

Moreover, the Syrian security services arrested the Palestinian young woman 'AsmaaQasim Khalil' days ago from her home in the town of Artouz in Damascus suburb. She is from Khan Al Shieh camp, and the reasons and place of detention are unknown yet.

In addition, Syrian security forces arrested the refugee "Awad Khalil Ahmed," (36) years, from Muzareeb town while he was on his way to work. It is referred that he is originally from the town of Al Naema in Safed-Palestine.

In the same context, the Syrian security released the Palestinian refugee "Samir Hassan" representative of the Alnidal front and an administrator of Hemma Youth Group in Khan Al Shieh camp, after he was arrested by



Syrian security services on Koukab checkpoint, and then he was transferred to the hospital.

It is noted that the AGPS documented the names of 903 Palestinian prisoners in Syrian prisons during the war events, and their fate or places of detention is known yet. The AGPS also documented the names of 399 Palestinian victims who died under torture in the Syrian branches and prisons, as well as, the AGPS issued a statement earlier in which demanded the Syrian authorities to disclose the fate of Palestinian detainees and release them, believing that what happens in prisons is a crime by all standards.

Victims

The 20-year-old Palestinian refugee 'Husam Rashid,' from the Yarmouk camp died, as he is a PLA officer.



Recent Updates

The remained residents of the Yarmouk camp are suffering from many living crises due to the blockade imposed on the camp several months ago, as well as due to ISIS control on the camp.

Residents are complaining of the high prices of food, which is observed in the past few days in the camp markets, where the price of a kilo of sugar is 500 Syrian pounds, while a kilo of rice (300) Syrian pounds,



while the price of a kilo of flour has exceeded (600) SP, Al Masbaha (600) SP, tomatoes (300) Syrian pounds, and the cucumber is (300) SP.

Meanwhile, the Yarmouk refugee camp witnessed a state of calm on all fighting axes, while ISIS and Al-Nusra Front are still imposing their control on 60% of its area.

In terms of relief aspect, Palestine Charity Committee distributed meals to the displaced Palestinian refugees in the towns of Yalda, Beit Sahem, and Babbila, as part of the campaign launched by the Committee in Ramadan under the name of "Iftar Saem."

Jafra Foundation prepares breakfast meals in the Jafra kitchen in the towns of Yalda and Babbila to be distributed to people in the region, while the Foundation volunteers fill drinking water for the residents.

Meanwhile, the 82-year- old man "Abu Adel" and his 80-year- wife got out of the Yarmouk camp by Beit Sahem checkpoint to Jaffa hospital in the capital Damascus, to receive treatment there.

The residents of Khan Al Shieh camp, which is the second largest Palestinian refugee camps in Syria, complain of humanitarian crises as a result of the escalated military confrontations between the free army groups and the regular army in the surrounding areas.

The military confrontations involved the camp in the overheating bloody conflict in Syria and had a negative impact on the population in terms of the continued closure of all roads linking the camp and its neighboring regions except Zakya - Khan Al Shieh road.

Residents are forced to go through Zakia road despite the risks they face following the outbreak of clashes between the regular army and groups of FSA between now and then.

Closing the only road leading to the camp by the regular army and tighten their security procedures was negatively reflected on the availability of the necessary food supplies, while many varieties of food supplies ran out and the prices of other types was increased.

In the same context, a state of relative stability experienced by the residents of Jaramana camp, which is just eight kilometers away from the Syrian capital Damascus, and is located on the road to Damascus International Airport, but the residents are suffering from lack of basic services and infrastructure.

In addition, residents complain of rising house rents and the increase in demand, prompting them to live in stifling conditions, as well as unemployment rates rise at a time when aid from charities and UNRWA were decreased.



It should be noted that the camp is witnessing significant crowding because of the large displacement movement from the Palestinian camps in Damascus.

Lebanon

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Tire city south of Lebanon finished distributing food aid provided by the "humanitarian foundations" for the displaced Palestinian Syrians at Bas, Rashideia, and Alburj Alshamali camps.

360 rations were distributed in Bas camp, 270 rations were distributed in Al Rashideia camp, and 700 rations were distributed in Alburj Alshamali camp. It is referred that the Palestinian refugees in Lebanon suffer from difficult living conditions, especially after the reduction of UNRWA assistance provided to them, and Lebanese authorities tightening under laws that prohibit the Syrian-Palestinian to work on its territory.



Turkey

Al Wafaa European Campaign distributed Ramadan Food aid to the Palestinian families displaced from Syria to Turkey in the city of Kilis south of the country yesterday.

Nearly 160 Palestinian families were benefited from the distribution campaign in an effort to alleviate their suffering and tight live in Turkey.

It is worth mentioning that the number of Palestinian families displaced from Syria in Turkey, according to unofficial statistics, ranging between 3000 to 4000 Palestinian refugees, who suffer from difficult living conditions due to the poor financial resources and the spread of unemployment.



Numbers and Statistics till 29/6/2015

- *80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*



- *The number of Palestinian detainees who were documented by the AGPS has reached 901 detainees, and 398 victims were killed due to torture in the Syrian prisons.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 732 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 802 days, water was cut for 292 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 176 victims.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 613 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 594 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 796 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 439 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
