Recent Updates

Yalda checkpoint of the Syrian armed opposition groups closed the road between Yarmouk camp and Yalda area after disagreements between ISIS alongside Al Nusra in the Yarmouk camp and armed opposition groups in Yalda.

Meanwhile, a statement was issued yesterday by the Consultative Council of Yalda, Babbila, and beitsahem towns confirmed the closure of all roads between all these towns on the one hand and Yarmouk and Al Hajar Al Aswad on the other hand except for a humanitarian corridor.

The statement pointed out that this road will be subject to a large security inspection for men and women, and it prevents the entry of military factions' members whatever their affiliation, only after being searched.



The Statement Issued by the Consultative Council

Consultative Council explained that these procedures were the result of what was suffered by the people of those three towns recently; such as



assassination, targeting with explosive devices and mine by extremists as described by the statement.

The latest assassination was against imams in Yalda, while the statement also stressed that any member belongs to Al-Nusra Front or ISIS will be discovered in these towns will be killed immediately.

In the same context, a delegation of notables of Yarmouk camp and head of the civil Council 'Fawzi Hamid' visited Yalda area to resolve the problem closing the road.

It is worth mentioning that the only port of food and aid entry to the camp's trapped residents is Yalda area, but the armed opposition groups accused ISIS and Al Nusra in the Yarmouk camp and Al Hajar Al Aswad the assassination of many of its members and a number of activists in Yalda.

On the other hand, the head of the PLO Political Department, Ambassador Anwar Abdul Hadi, said that the Syrian government agreed to the burial of dead people who are displaced in the Yarmouk refugee camp in Yarmouk cemetery.

Turning to northern Syria, Nairab camp in Aleppo suffers of the migration of its citizens, especially doctors and medical personnel working in the camp from all disciplines, where the number of doctors who have migrated from the camp since the beginning of events in Syria, according to the AGPS correspondent is 17 doctors.

The reporter pointed out that the number of doctors currently in the camp is five doctors with a number of nurses, all of whom are working in



Palestine hospital, which is the only hospital in the camp that performs surgeries and offers medical services to the people of the camp and nearby towns.

Palestine hospital suffers from a lack of official authorization, making it more vulnerable than once to close; Palestine Hospital was specialized at childbirth surgeries only, but the situation in Syria and Nairab camp, and the distance of the city from the camp forced the hospital management to contract with a number of doctors from the city of Aleppo to do Simple surgical operations in it.



As for the medical centers in the camp, there is a medical center for UNRWA only offers simple medical services to the children of the camp, who complain of the lack of its effectiveness.

Moreover, cultural center was turned into a medical clinic in the beginning of events in Syria by efforts of some donors of Palestinian organizations and a number of residents. The medical clinic was outfitted with an operations room and some medical equipment, but it still lacks the medical support by the Health Directorate in Syria, and perhaps the recent poisoning incidents and not to discover the main causes, indicates the crisis in the health field experienced by Neirab.

In the meantime, continued power cuts for long hours and the wave of high temperature in Syria have deepened the suffering of Khan Dannon



Residents in Damascus suburb, who suffer from poor services in infrastructure, high prices, continuous water and telecommunications cut for long periods, and the spread of unemployment due to the ongoing war in Syria.

Detainees

Syrian security services continue to arrest ten Palestinian refugees from the same family since 12- 6-2013. They are: Mahira Mohammed Amayri, Hadeel Mahmoud Amayri, Aseel Mahmoud Amayri, Wedad Mahmoud Amayri, Razan Mahmoud Amayri, Suhair Amayri, Maysa Jamal Idris, Firas Walid Desouki, and his children Hamza Firas Desouki and Hala Firas Desouki. They were arrested by members of Nasreen Street checkpoint at Al Tadamon neighborhood of the Syrian army regulars.



Release

Syrian security released the Palestinian refugee woman Bahia Al Aydi, 60 years from the Yarmouk refugee camp, after being detained for nearly a year and a half.



Numbers and Statistics till 29/7/2015

- *80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 761 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 831 days, water was cut for 321 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.*
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 642 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 623 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 825 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 468 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
