### **RECENT UPDATES**

*The Syrian security forces have released the Palestinian refugee, "Mohammed Salah Saleh Shakoosh", after 5 months of arrest. Shakoosh, Khan Eshieh camp resident, was arrested for the second time, where he had spent 18 months in prison in the first time with no charge. It is pointed that AGPS documented 106 as enforced disappearances from Khan Eshieh camp in the Syrian prisons.*



*In the south of the country, on the outskirts of Daraa camp, clashes have been triggered between the opposition factions and Assad regime forces. In the meantime, artillery and tanks of regime bombarded the neighborhoods of Daraa-Albalad near the Palestinian camp. It is worth mentioning that refugees in Daraa camp are suffering from shelling and severe lack of basics of living needs and the cutting off water and electricity since two years.*





*Meanwhile, Hama camp's population and other Syrian refugee families live in a quite calm situation compared to other camps, but the security forces have continued to impose a cordon on the camp in the entrances and exits, and the crackdown campaign from time to time. In terms of the economic condition in the camp, the unemployment rate rose due to the security tension as the most residents depend on the relief aid which is very limited.*

*In a different context, "Amjad Yacoob", a Palestinian refugee from Al Yarmook camp who had been arrested on the checkpoint of Assad regime in 8 September in Bait-Sahem, is still disappeared by Syrian authorities. 1025 Palestinian detainees were documented until now while 426 tortured to death, AGPS said.*



### **NGOs**

*"Palestine charity Association" in cooperating with "World Assembly of Muslim Youth (WAMY)" and "Tareeq Alhaya Charity" have distributed winter packages aid to Palestinian refugees in Al-Mozereeb town in south Syria. It is mentioned that Palestinians and thousands of Syrian families*



*in the south country fled to the countryside in Al-Mozereeb town after about 70% of Dara'a camp and other neighbourhoods have been destroyed by regime shelling.*

### ***Greece***

*A group of Palestinian families who fled Syria have reached Mytilene Island in Greece. The families crossed Aegean Sea from Turkish coast where 21 rubber boats carrying hundreds of Syrian and Palestinian refugees, most of them women and children, had sailed out yesterday. The winter weather imposes significant risks to the refugees' trips these days, in absence of any feasible solution from the parties involved in the crisis.*



### ***Palestinians of Syria in numbers and Statistics until 30 December 2015***

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*

- *More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 911 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 981 days, water cut for 471 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims .*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 772 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 973 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 617 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Homs and AedeinHamma: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
