

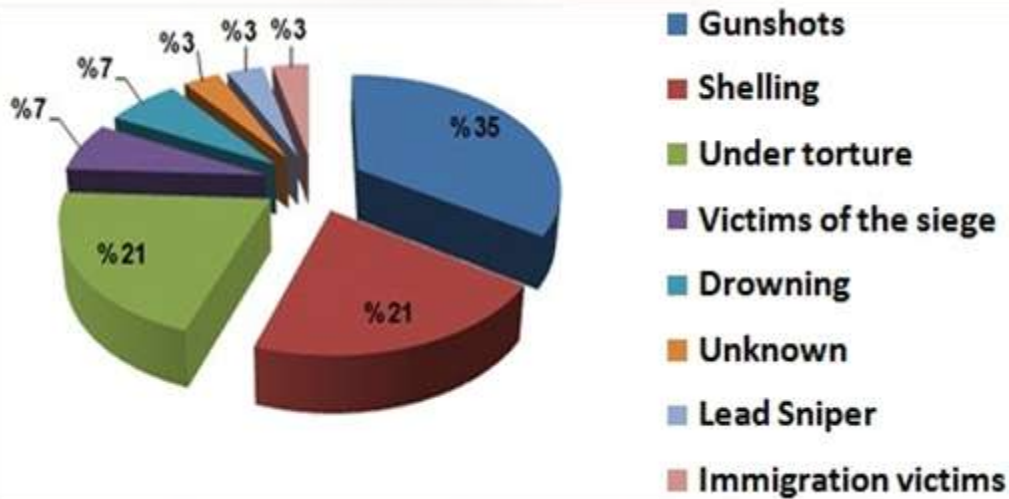

“Action Group: 29 Palestinian Refugees were killed During Last November in Syria, Including 6 Due to Torture”



- Water cut in the Yarmouk camp is still continuing for 86 days respectively.
- The power return back after two years cut at AL Nairab camp in Aleppo.
- The pace of bombing and clashing raises at Handarat camp and its surroundings.
- The Action Group: 23 victims from Jermana camp were killed due to the events in Syria.
- Palestine Charity Committee in the Yarmouk camp continues the project” Let’s make their Winter Warm”.
- 56 Palestinian refugees still detained in the Egyptian prisons.
- A Palestinian refugee in Austria stands naked in the cold protesting on the delay of the reunion.

Statistics

The Action Group announced that 29 Palestinian refugees were killed during last November, including 6 were killed due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons, while 10 refugees were killed due to gunshot, 6 refugees due to bombing, 2 refugees were killed due to siege and lack of medical care, 3 refugees were killed while trying to immigrate to the European countries, 2 of them was drawn, 1 refugee was killed by sniper shot, and 1 refugee was killed by unknown reasons.

Recent Updates

The residents of the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees, south of the Syrian capital Damascus, are suffering of the continuing water cut for 86 days respectively, as well as many living and economic crises due to the strict siege imposed by the regular army and groups of the PFGC for 516 days respectively, since they prevented the entry and exit of residents form and into the camp in addition to the prevention of food, flour, medicines, and fuel.

A number of activists and dignitaries of the Yarmouk camp, either from inside or outside the camp, demand to activate the initiative of neutralize the camp and lifting the siege, where the people of the Yarmouk refugee camp no longer demanding the entry of food only because UNRWA enters limited amounts of relief materials, but it exceeded to claim to follow practical and real steps to end the tragedy and suffering through the full break of siege imposed on the camp and neutralized it. They also demanded the application of provisions of the initiative and to allow people outside Yarmouk to return back to it, and to treat the camp like the surrounding areas such as Yalda, Babbila, and Beit Sahem, which signed a truce with the Syrian regime, they also demanded the return of public services, particularly drinking water.

In the same context, electricity returned to light up the lanes, streets, and houses of Al Nairab camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo after nearly two years cut, as our correspondent confirmed that the voltage is back to a large part of the camp areas, as he emphasized that maintenance workers at the power company will deliver electricity to all camp areas within a few hours, indicated that the power supply has been cut from the



camp since 13/01/2013 prompting its inhabitants to resort to share private electricity generators to light their homes and commercial shops, which added a new burden.

In the meantime, the pace of the violent clashes are still going on between the Syrian opposition and the regular army forces in the vicinity of Handarat camp, the central prison in Aleppo, and surrounding villages, coincided with bombing with explosive barrels between now and then, as the residents still complain the consequences of the suffering caused by the displacement from their camp 588 days ago respectively to neighboring areas in the city of Aleppo.

In Damascus suburb, people of Jermana camp suffers from drinking water and electricity cut for long hours, while the camp, which live in a state of calm compared to other camps, suffer from difficult economic conditions where people complain of unemployment, rising food prices, and the high cost of rent houses.

On the other hand, the AGPS confirmed that the number of victims from Jermana camp in Damascus suburb, who died since the beginning of the



events in Syria, has reached 23 victims, including 12 victims died by shelling, while 5 were killed by gunshot, 5 were kidnapped and then killed, and a refugee was killed by a car bomb.

Civil Work Committees

Palestine Charity Committee in the Yarmouk refugee camp continue to distribute some aid to the families in an attempt to ease their suffering with the start of winter, where the project includes the families of the Yarmouk refugee camp and the displaced families of Sbeina, Hujaira, Husseneia, Bowaida, and Gazal area.

The aids, which distributed within the project "Let's Make their Winter Warm", including amount of money in order to help them buy firewood for heating, due to the high cost of heating and other materials, fireplace, to the families who do not have a fireplace, blankets, to families who do not have enough blankets.

According to the Committee, the home state is assessing of readiness to protect the family from the cold of winter, and in the case the house needs a simple restoration, the services department will work on it, in case of the house is Uninhabitable, the Committee will work on securing a new home.





Egypt

Although the conversion of the charge, leveled by the public prosecutor to them from entering the country illegally to refugees of war, "56" Palestinian refugees are still detained by the Egyptian authorities, after being detained while trying to reach Italy from Turkish beaches in 25 of last month, where they fell victim to a scam by smugglers, who left them on one of the islands off the Egyptian shores, and the Egyptian authorities arrested them. It is noteworthy that Egyptian security had been released all detained Syrians while continued detention of "56" Palestinians, due to the reject All the surrounding countries to receive them, where their choice was between deported to Syria or stay in jail.

Austria

A Palestinian refugee from Syria in Austria, undress and stand naked, in spite of the low temperature in Austria, where he said that he did so in an attempt to draw attention and to protest against the delay of reunion procedures in Europe, where posted on his page on Facebook "I took off my clothes in the cold due to the injustice done to and for the Palestinian and the Syrian refugees in Austria and all of Europe, we left our children in displacement camps in Syria, Jordan and Turkey in a new Palestinian alienation, as we have fled from the conflict in Syria in order to protect our children, I crave to speed up reunions for All refugee families. "

It is noteworthy that reunion procedures in most European towns now take a period of between six months and a year, which puts the refugees and their families in a state of tension and compels them significant economic burden as most families were distributed between Syria, Lebanon, and Turkey.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 3/12/2014

- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 516 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 599 days, water was cut for 86 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 158 victims.*
- *41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.*
- *96 PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.*

- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **418** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **388** days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **588** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **233** days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- **Khan Danoun Camp:** - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- **Al Nairab Camp:** - Power is still cut for more than a year.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
