“173 Palestinian Refugees Killed in Dara'a Camp Due to the Conflict in Syria”



Daraa camp

- A state of calm prevailed in Khan Dannoun camp in Damascus city.

Recent Updates

Action Group for Palestinians of Syria announced that the number of Palestinian refugees who were killed because of the outgoing events in Syria reached 173 victims, according to statistics published last month. The Group noted that the number of Palestinian refugees in Syria victims has reached 2290 refugees until the end of last May.

In the same context, Dara'a camp is still exposing to bombing with a storm of missiles that targeted different areas, the only people fear of the deterioration of living conditions is poverty and the continuous outage of power and telecommunications all over the camp for long periods.

Thus, the remaining residents of Dara'a' camp complain about the lack of fuels and bread in addition to the significant raise of basic supplies prices, as the unemployment spread make it worse ,where most of people stopped working because of the deterioration of security situation in the camp.

Meanwhile, a state of relatively quietness mixed with anxious and dissatisfaction prevailed in the Yarmouk camp south of Damascus because of not implementing the agreement of breaking the Yarmouk siege. An activist demanded to treat the camp like other regions such as Yelda, Babeila and Beit Sahem which they agree to a truce.

The activist confirmed that this step can stop the real tragic situation that the residents live because of the strict siege imposed on Yarmouk camp. The siege imposed by the Regular Army and the Public Front- General Command a year ago which led to a humanitarian crisis resulted in the death of 151 people because of the hunger and the siege.

Moreover, people of Khan AL Sheih camp in Damascus city live in a state of relatively quietness and the shortage of health supplies continuous, where all hospitals have stopped working except for UNRWA clinic which presents simple medical services. The camp also suffers of repeatedly interruptions of roads that connect it with the city center due to the bombing and the clashes on its vicinity.

Residents of Alrmdan camp suffer of a real economic crisis due to the reflection of the manifestations of the conflict in Syria, which led to the spread of unemployment and the severe shortage of food, medicine and fuel supplies in addition to the prices raise.

It is worth mentioning that Alrmdan camp is a Palestinian refugee camp in Syria that is located 50km eastern south of Damascus city, 9km away from Al Dameer town. It was established in the fifties of the twentieth century, after years of the Palestine Nakba. Many families live in the camp; they came from the cities and villages of the old Palestine like Tiberias, Hittin, Alshajara, Al Ramla, Ajour, Safed and Dalata.

People of Khan Danoun camp complain on the high prices of the food materials in addition to the unemployment spread in the camp. It is noted that the camp receives families of other camps and compounds who were exposed to bombing, shelling or siege. This problem led to raise the prices of the rent houses in the camp.



Turkey

On Sunday, 6th of July 2014, a team from the Human Rights Watch visited a Palestinian of Syria refugees' shelter in Kals city on the borders of Turkey. The visit aims to document the cases of human rights violations in the Syrian prisons. The team performed so many interviews with former prisoners in the Syrian prisons.

The Action Group for the Palestinians of Syria announced that 200 Palestinians of Syria refugees were killed under torture in the Syrian prisons since the beginning of the conflicts in Syria.

It is referred that hundreds of Palestinians of Syria families have left to Turkey because the exposure of their camps to bombings and siege. Most of the refugees suffer of legal and economic problems because they entered in an illegal way to Turkey, moreover, the Turkish embassy in Lebanon refuse to give them visas without giving causes.

Jordan

The Palestinians of Syria refugees, from the Cyper City compound in Jordan, appealed and called the human rights organizations, the Palestinian Liberation Organization, Palestinian factions and UNRWA to help them and solve their problems.



The refugees in Cyper City compound feel isolation from the out world and they are treated like if they are detained in military camps that look like a prison. The refugees are not allowed to get out unless they have guarantees and bounds.

The Palestinian Syrian refugees complain from the inhumane treatment inside the compound which pushed some of them to run away out of the camp and they are now wanted to the Jordanian Security.

It is worth mentioning that the Cyper City compound is a building contains of 6 floors and 140 rooms Located in the Ramtha city 100km north of Amman near the Syrian borders. The building is for Asian workers who work in factories in Irbid.

The number of Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan reached 10687, according to UNRWA statistics. The refugees are distributed as follows:- 2391 are in Irbid, Zarqa, Amman, Al Zatar Camp, Cyper City. 48% of the refugees under the age 18 and 52% are females, 30% of the women are a souse of support to their families.

The rate of families is 4.1, 196 are in Cyper City. The information refers to that 56% of the refugees coming from Syria to Jordan are holding the Jordanian passports , 22% are holding the Palestinian passports and 21% are holding the Syrian passports.
