“Activists Launch an Electronic Campaign to call the Egyptian Authorities to Well Treat the Detained Refugees”



Detainees held by the Egyptian authorities

- The Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees is without water for 60 days.
- Entering a limited quantity of water and food materials to the Yarmouk camp.
- The Regular Army prevents Al Husayneyya camp residents to return back to their houses since October 2013.
- The Syrian Security arrested 4 descendents from Al Aedin camp in Homs.

Recent Updates

A number of Human Rights Activists launched a campaign titled as “The Egyptian Authorities: A Good Treatment to the Palestinian and Syrian refugees”. The campaign was launched through the website of AVAAZ international organization which struggles for the issues of human rights, environment and freedom of speech. The activists called the Egyptian Authorities not to deport the detained Palestinian and Syrian refugees to Syria because it is dangerous on their lives.

It is mentioned that the Egyptian Authorities detain more than one hundred Palestinian and Syrian refugees in Karmouz prison. The refugees were victims of a scam by a smuggler in Turkey after they dealt with him to reach the European beaches but he was dishonest and they found themselves in the Egyptian prisons. The refugees are detained amid fears of deporting them to Syria where the Egyptian Authorities previously detained dozens of refugees with inhumane conditions and deported some of them to Syria.

On the other hand, the water cuts on the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees inters its 60th days respectively where the residents were obliged to go to the surrounding areas to secure their needs in addition to the power cut and the loss of food and medical materials in the camp because of the siege. The siege is imposed on the camp by the Regular army and the PFGC and led to 155 victims due to the shortage of food and medical care.

In the same context, UNRWA entered a limited quantity of food and water to be distributed on the Yarmouk besieged people for about 490 days.

Meanwhile, the Syrian Regular Army and some Palestinian factions prevented the residents of Al Husayneyya camp to return back to their houses despite the control of the regular army since October 2013 after violent clashes with the Free Army. The residents of the camp are still waiting to return back after they got promises from official sides but they have nothing achieved till now. The residents are suffering of the economic burdens especially after the high cost of rent houses and the unemployment spread. It is mentioned that the residents were displaced to the surrounding camps and towns.



Al Husayneyya camp

In Homs, on 3rd of November 2014, the Syrian Security arrested four residents of Al Aedin camp, they are: Mahmoud darwish from Safad in Palestine, Mohammed Yousif Al Ghalawi from Safad in Palestine, Motaz Khalid Omar from Al Shajara village in Palestine at Al Zabzoub behind Belal Mosque in the eastern neighborhood in the camp. A member of checkpoints that surround the camp arrested the old man Ibrahim Farouq Deyyab on 6th of November 2014, during his work as a taxi driver.



The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics

- ***The Yarmouk Camp:*** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **490** days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than **573** days, water was cut for **60** days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached **155** victims.
- **41** Palestinian Syrian refugees were killed outside of Syria.
- **93** PLO members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **392** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **361** days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **561** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **207** days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- **Khan Danoun Camp:** - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- **Al Nairab Camp:** - Power is still cut for more than a year.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
